II. NARRATIVE SUMMARY - During the first part of the month, major effort was directed toward the success of Operation ESSEX. From 6 November to 17 November, the men of the 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines engaged NVA forces in hard fought combat, driving them from the security they had known in the ANTENNA VALLEY. (See Part IV, # F). Despite heavy operational commitments in the ANTENNA VALLEY, 2/5 Marines maintained complete control of all critical areas in the TAOR.

On 27 November, 2/5 was directed by 1st Marine Division to bring the BALD EAGLE to a 15 minute alert status for possible commitment in Operation FOSTER. Within 90 minutes after the call, Company G, which had been deployed throughout the TAOR, was ready to go. The Company, however, was never committed.

During the latter part of the month, activity along the Liberty Road between the AN HOA Combat Base, (AT875475), and the PHU LAC (6) Platoon Outpost increased. On two separate occasions 2/5 Marines engaged enemy forces of superior size and inflicted casualties while only suffering 1 USMC WIA. Their quick reaction and courageous skill threw sizable enemy units into a state of confusion while effective application of supporting arms made enemy escape routes perilous and costly.

4. Narrative Summary: Chargeable strength remained below 90% of the manning level for the first three quarters of the month, however, with new replacements, the battalion is presently in Class I with 97% of the manning level. Critical shortages in the enlisted ranks are 5 GySgt's and 14 SSgt's 0369. Present critical officer shortages are 1 Capt 0402, 1 Capt 0202, 1 WO 0130 and 7 Lt's 0302.

5. Problem Areas.

(a) Administrative supplies continue to be unavailable. The Battalion presently has a limited supply of fitness reports, VA Insurance Forms for SGLI, mimeograph paper and Man-O-War correction compound.

(b) Office machines, especially typewriters and the mimeograph machine, are in poor condition and the time required for repair is excessive.

C. Morale, PX and Chaplain's Activities.

1. Morale is considered excellent.
2. The Marine Corps Exchange located at AN HOA provides excellent service. The exchange is resupplied with the arrival of the conveyer from DANANG Combat Base. All necessities are available and a sufficient stock is always maintained.
3. Chaplain's Activities: A total of 14 Protestant services and 15 Catholic Masses were conducted during the month. Three hundred

and thirty-nine Marines attended the Protestant services while another 286 Marines participated in the Catholic Masses which were conducted by the Division Chaplain. The Battalion Chaplain conducted a memorial service for 2/5 Marines killed during the month of November: 375 men participated in the service. The Battalion Chaplain visited 5 companies in the field and made 39 hospital visits; 18 to 1st Medical Battalion and 21 to the Naval Support Activity Hospital. In addition, the Chaplain conducted 10 personal counseling interviews and delivered 3 lectures on Religion in VIETNAM to 202 interested Marines.

D. Intelligence.

1. General. Accurate and timely intelligence collection was accomplished during the month of November by processing information from various sources, including the 1st Marine Division G-2, 5th Marine Regiment S-2, 7th Marine Regiment, 3rd CIT, 13 IIT, AN HOA and NONG SON Industrial Complex, DUC DUC District S-2, DIOCC, and the local populace within the 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines TAOR.

a. Frequent liaison visits were made with DUC DUC District Headquarters and AN HOA/NONG SON Security to supplement the information obtained from the above sources.

b. A careful and immediate screening of all captured documents and materials for tactical information was conducted and the information was exploited where practicable.

c. A continuing study of all incidents within the 2/5 TAOR, recon patrols reports, information received from higher echelon, A/O reports and close coordination with FSCC allowed this Battalion to adjust its nightly H&I and TPQ 10's to the maximum advantage.

d. The S-2 scouts and Kit Carson scouts were employed to assist this Battalion in gathering information for intelligence purposes. The scouts were assigned to companies in the field to assist in the proper handling of captured documents, equipment and information obtained at company level.

2. A sub-team from the 3rd CIT assisted the S-2 section during the month of November in intelligence gathering. Detainees and documents were screened for information concerning the VC infrastructure in this area. The team assisted the section in locating and recovering the remains of six NVA personnel killed during Operation ESSEX.

3. The S-2 Section conducted a total of 12 hours troop indoctrination to personnel newly assigned to this Battalion. The instruction emphasized the importance of intelligence and the proper handling of POWs, captured enemy equipment and security of military information. An attempt is made to impress on the personnel in these classes that important information can be obtained concerning the enemy if the proper procedures are followed in their contact with the VC forces.

4. Intelligence information was disseminated via the Battalion Commander's daily briefing. Intelligence briefings primarily included the proceeding 24 hours activities and any information obtained concerning enemy movements and locations which could effect the mission of this Battalion.

E. Training.

1. In November, 293 new men completed the Battalion Indoctrination Course. Personal sanitation and hygiene, with emphasis on the care of feet, was stressed during the course. The Law of Land Warfare was instructed with a "what it means to me" flavor to demonstrate it's importance to the individual Marine in VIETNAM.

2. The firing range continues to show high daily usage. Emphasis continues to be placed on familiarization firing while the zeroing of battle sights on all individual weapons in the organization is assured. Along with firing, considerable time is spent inspecting weapons to insure that each Marine maintains his weapon in a satisfactory condition. Care and Cleaning of the M-16 rifle during monsoon weather conditions was particularly emphasized.

F. Special Operations.

1. Maximum recon/security around the NONG SON Company Outpost, (AT81438) was attained through the daily employment of platoon (-) and reinforced squad patrols. Strict emphasis was placed on the local security of the coal mine complex, while continuous surveillance was maintained on the SONG THU BON from the upper NONG SON position. Frequent patrolling in the NINH BINH (3)/CAP N-1 area insured maximum protection for that lone Marine Outpost.
2. The PHU LAC (6) Platoon Outpost, (AT925527); was temporarily increased to company (-) size, as frequent enemy probes were conducted throughout the month. In addition, foul weather made the Liberty Road more and more critical, necessitating heavier security commitments. Platoon (-) and reinforced squad patrols moved daily in all areas adjacent to the PHU LAC (6) position, with emphasis on avenues of enemy approach.
3. To arrest enemy mining activity on Liberty Road, squad sized OP's and platoon patrol bases were continually in position. Squad patrols emanating from the PPB's, provided saturation of all known enemy avenues of approach to the all important MSR.
4. Combat patrols, listening posts, and platoon bases/ambushes were employed on a continual basis adjacent to the AN HOA and NONG SON Combat Bases. In an attempt to keep the VC off balance, reinforced squads were periodically deployed to the Combined Action units within the TAOR. These squads were deployed quickly and only at those times when the VC threat was considered imminent.
5. Platoon combat/security patrols moving with combat engineer sweep teams traversed the Liberty Road daily and proved most effective in reducing enemy terrorist tactics along the road.

6. Waterway Control was effected through constant deployment of daily patrols and ambushes to positions of advantage along the SONG THU BON. In addition, aerial observation was employed whenever it became available.

7. 2nd Battalion (-)(Rein), 5th Marines conducted Operation ESSEX in the vicinity of ANTEEN VALLEY from 6-17 Nov 1967. (See Part IV # F)

8. Company F conducted a one day company sized S&D operation in vicinity GS (AT9151) on 30 Nov.

G. Nuclear, Biological, Chemical Warfare and Defense.

1. CS Grenades, M-72 and CS-1 grenades, and M-25A2 air delivery pods were utilized to help clear tunnels, caves, bunkers and fortifications during battalion, company, platoon and squad sized operations and activities conducted during the month.

2. The 35mm cartridge, 16 tube, E-8 launchers were utilized as a defensive weapon system at NONG SON, CAPN-1, and on company and battalion sized operations during the month.

3. Fixed wing aircraft was employed to deliver CS and CNC-1 gas during Operation ESSEX. Delivery of the CS agents was ineffective, as the gas failed to settle into the target area.

H. Command and Control - LtCol G. C. McNAUGHTON commanded the 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines during the month of Nov. The Battalion remained under the administrative control of the 5th Marine Regiment and the operational control of the 1st Marine Division.

I. Close Combat

1. This Battalion engaged in hard fought, close combat with crack enemy forces during the first part of the month; when the Battalion went to the field in Operation ESSEX. (See Part IV # 6). During the latter part of the month, 2/5 Marines engaged in close combat with sizeable enemy units in ambush situations. During all engagements, 2/5 Marines performed with unequalled tenacity and skill.

a. On 1 November, Marines from Company H, located at (AT925527), observed 1 VN male with his hands up, approaching friendly lines. He was holding a CHIEU HOI leaflet. The man was apprehended and forwarded to S-2 where it was determined that he was a member of the 21st NVA Regiment. The former NVA brought 2 ChiCom grenades and 1 cartridge belt with him, but reported that he had been afraid to come in with his weapon.

b. Mining along the Liberty Road remained a threat throughout the period. On 3 November, 3 separate mining incidents were reported. At 1145H a Marine sitting in an OP position tripped a booby trap was wounded and subsequently medevaced. Shortly thereafter, a tank detonated a mine vicinity (AT910507). The incident resulted in the medical evacuation of 3 Marines as well as heavy damage to the tank. Later that afternoon, as the convoy was returning north, an 8" SP hit a mine vicinity (AT915508) and was towed to PHU LAC (6).

c. On 3 November, a Company G combat patrol observed 2 enemy with packs. Simultaneously, the enemy spotted the Marines and attempted escape. Warning shots were fired and ignored. Marines took the fleeing enemy under fire, killing one. The second enemy escaped into the thick underbrush.

d. On the night of 5 November, Marines manning the PHU LAC (6) Outpost received 5 small arms rounds wounding 1 Marine. Fire was returned and the wounded Marine med-evaced.

e. At 060001H CAP N-2, located at (AT888473) received 250 rounds small arms fire from an estimated 6-10 VC vicinity (AT893471). The combined unit returned fire and enemy fire subsided. At first light Popular Forces and Marines moved into the area of incident, locating 1 dead VN male; the father of a local PF. The villagers in the area were questioned and it was determined that he had been killed by a VC unit of estimated company size that had moved through the night before. All evidence of enemy casualties had been removed.

f. On 9 November, an Ontos providing security for a convoy moving north, detonated a mine vicinity (AT907487). The damaged vehicle was towed to PHU LAC (6).

g. On 10 November, CAP N-2 received in excess of 1000 rounds small arms and automatic weapons fire from vicinity (AT887476-AT893476-AT890478-AT897477). Heavy small arms and artillery fires were returned and the area immediately searched by a combined patrol. Although no evidence of enemy casualties could be located, villagers reported that 15 NVA had taken the CAP position under fire and then moved north. It is significant to note that this is the first time such a heavy volume of fire has been received during daylight hours. Further, NVA reported in this close to the CAP N-2 position is a rarity.

h. On 13 November, a Marine in a Company F security patrol tripped a booby trapped M-26 grenade vicinity (AT909490). An LZ was secured and the wounded Marine evacuated.

i. On 19 November, an M-26 grenade rigged as a booby trap was tripped by a Marine in a Company G security force. An LZ was secured and the wounded Marine evacuated.

- j. On 20 November, a Marine in a Company H platoon patrol tripped a booby trap vicinity (AT898486) of estimated 81mm mortar size. The incident resulted in 4 wounded Marines; all were evacuated.
- k. On 21 November, a truck moving on the Liberty Road vicinity (AT908504) detonated a box mine of estimated 40 lb size. The incident resulted in the evacuation of 7 wounded Marines and the destruction of the vehicle.
- l. On 22 November, a Marine in a Company G OP tripped an M-26 grenade booby trap vicinity (AT912478) and received wounds which necessitated his evacuation.
- m. On 23 November, two Vietnamese AN HOA Complex security guards working with Marines vicinity (AT910500) were killed when they tripped a booby trap of estimated 105mm size. The bodies were evacuated to AN HOA.
- n. On 26 November, a Company H squad ambush in the vicinity (AT915-508) observed VC moving into their killing zone. No sooner had the enemy entered the killing zone when the Marine unit received fire from both flanks. The ambush opened fire and observed 3 enemy fall in the killing zone. Artillery fires poured into the area in support of the engaged Marines while the STRIKE FORCE moved out of AN HOA in an attempt to cut off the fleeing VC. When the initial contact was broken, the 2/5 Marines moved quickly into the killing zone to conduct the search; 1 ChiCom grenade, and 1 U.S. carbine were located. The STRIKE FORCE tied in with the ambush unit and set in around the ambush site while artillery fires were pumped into suspected routes of enemy egress. At first light a detailed search of the ambush area revealed 2 VC bodies with weapons including 1 Thompson submachine-gun and 1 M-14 rifle. In addition, 10 booby trap devices were found in their possession, indicating that they may have been the "A" team.
- o. On the night of 29 November, a Company H squad ambush became engaged with a sizeable enemy force moving across Liberty Road vicinity (AT905505). An account of the incident follows:
- At 291900H, Company H ambushes moved out from PHU LAC (6) Combat Outpost to set in vicinity (AT913508-AT911505-AT917513).
- At 292050H, Squad ambushes H3A and H3B reported being set in at vicinity (AT911505) and (AT914506) respectively.
- At 292056H, Squad ambush, H3C, while moving to ambush site heard VN voices on both sides of their position. At the same time they observed 3 enemy moving onto the road. Squad ambush, H3B, heard VN voices 25 meters to their east. H3C set in an immediate action ambush position. Enemy troops with packs, individual and crew served weapons, started moving across the road. The squad ambush counted 237 enemy move across the road.

At 292100H, H3C and H3B reported being in enemy contact. H3A was ordered to move to and tie in with H3B. In the ensuing fire fight, it was determined that the enemy column had moved behind H3C who was presently moving down the road into position. Marines counted the size of the enemy unit and took rear elements under fire observing 3 enemy fall. A fourth enemy returning to retrieve a weapon, moved to within 4 feet of a Marine, at which time he was shot. Simultaneously H3B engaged what was a suspected flank unit for the major movement. Marines in H3C reported the enemy was moving in a column with a 2 feet interval between men. Their movement was rapid and noise discipline good with one exception; there was excessive talking in the enemy ranks. The Marine unit further reported the crying of women and children in the village the enemy had just moved through. It was reported that one enemy looked toward the Marines and said "Hello" as he passed - an apparent attempt to determine if the Marines were in fact there.

At 292103H, CO 2/5 alerted the STRIKE FORCE for possible commitment to the ambush site. H&S Company was directed to form a platoon on a standby basis to relieve Company G on the lines for possible commitment.

At 292110H, H3B and H3A linked up and started moving south to H3C's position.

At 292115H, a request for a flareship was submitted to CARSTAIRS (1). CARSTAIRS (1) advised of available SPOOKY aircraft. The aircraft was not requested so artillery could fire. E/2/11 commenced firing continuous illumination in support of the engaged Marines. Simultaneously one platoon of guns commenced firing HE into concentration I, vicinity (AT897503-AT908505). A second platoon commenced firing concentration N (AT896508-AT907509). Both of these concentrations cover known enemy routes of egress and movement. Forty-five rounds HE were fired on concentration L and 50 rounds HE were fired on concentration N.

At 292124H, H 3 became completely linked up and commenced exploitation of the enemy's confusion under the continuous illumination.

At 292125H, 8" battery fired 14 rounds HE zone/shift fire into vicinity (AT896508-AT907509) suspected area of enemy egress.

At 292130H, a Fire Fly was requested but never received.

At 292140H, 70 rounds HE fuze mixed quick and VT were zoned/shift fire from (AT908512) to (AT904502), also an escape route.

At 292145H, Flaership Basketball 246 arrived on station and artillery illumination was secured. At 2255H the aircraft developed mechanical difficulties and artillery illumination was resumed. Basketball 796 arrived on station at 2330H and reassumed the illumination mission.

At 2200H, E/2/11 fired 66 rounds HE zone/shift on another possible escape route vicinity (AT892513-AT882512).

At 292207H, H 3 reported the discovery of 1 enemy KIA, 1 weapon and 1 pack. (See Part IV # B Sit Rep #349 DTG 292400H).

At 292215H, 8" battery fired an additional 4 rounds HE into vicinity (AT901513).

At 292300H, E/2/11 fired 53 rounds HE fuze mixed zone/shift in an area of a known enemy trenchline vicinity (AT902502-AT905512).

At 292259H, OC 2/5 secured the STRIKE FORCE.

(Throughout the night a total of 141, 105 illumination rounds were fired. H 3 remained in position throughout the night searching the area of the ambush).

At 300600H, 1 platoon of Company F with CP moved out along Liberty Road picking up two platoons already in position on the road and moved into the objective area vicinity (AT904505). Company H moved a platoon to vicinity (AT909522) to block for Company F's sweep. A Company H platoon moved to vicinity (AT915505) checking the area east of road. All evidence of enemy casualties had been removed.

p. On 30 November, a Marine moving in a Company F S&D tripped a pressure type booby trap of unknown size vicinity (AT910508). An LZ was secured and the wounded Marine med-evac.

2. Although plagued by booby traps, 2/5 Marines continued to display the skill to flush the VC from his hiding place and the spirit to pursue and destroy.

J. Fire Support

1. Battery E, 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines in direct support of the 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines located at AN HOA Combat Base, supported units in the field during the month of November.

2. 1st Platoon, 3rd 8" Howitzer Battery and 1st Platoon 3rd 155 Gun Battery, both of the 11th Marines, also provided artillery support.

5. Significant Fire Support Events.

a. Battery E/2/11 in direct support of Operation ESSEX from 6 November to 17 November.

b. The Battery provided direct support to Operation FOSTER 14 November through 30 November, while continuing to accomplish the primary mission of support for 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines.

c. Outstanding close and continuous artillery support was provided on the nights of 27 November and 29 November with illumination and high explosives when two squad ambushes established solid contact with enemy forces.

K. Air Support.

1. Tactical Air Support. Tactical air support during Operation ESSEX included 35 close air support missions (71 sorties); 30 controlled by a TAC(A) and 5 controlled by the TACP. Total close air support for the month of November was 41 missions (81 sorties). In addition, 30 aerial observation/TACA(A) missions were flown during November. Three flare-ships and two "SPOOKY" gunships were also utilized. Two APD missions were flown during ESSEX. (See Part IV # F).

2. Logistical and Administrative Support. A total logistic missions were flown; 2 emergency missions, 60 priority and 10 routine. These were mostly in Support of ESSEX.

3. Med-evacs. A hundred and twenty-four med-evac requests involving 265 were submitted and completed. Thirty-five emergency, 54 priority and 35 routine missions.

4. TPQ-10. Forty-two TPQ-10 missions were flown resulting in a total of 43 tons of ordance being delivered.

5. Obtaining helicopter support at the time desired continues to be a problem excluding med-evacs which are usually completed in a reasonable time frame. Aerial Observation missions provided excellent support this month in both the role of visual recon and TAC (A).

L. Logistics

1. General.

a. The most important endeavor undertaken by the S-4 during the month of November was the logistical support of Operation ESSEX. This Battalion was assisted in this undertaking by the AN HOA Logistic Support Unit and Helicopter Support Teams. In addition to the HST stationed at AN HOA, a HST was located with CP group on Hill 170 in ANTENNA VALLEY and a team moved with each company. All resupply was flown from AN HOA to ANTENNA VALLEY by helicopter. In addition to the normal resupply missions, the Marines in the field received ice cream and cake on the Marine Corps Birthday.

b. On November 1, the Command Material Management Inspection Team arrived to inspect the Battalion. Ordance, communications, motor transport, food services, supply, and engineers were inspected. The Battalion was rated as satisfactory with discrepancies.

c. In the middle of the month the SLF (2nd Battalion, 3d Marines) arrived at AN HOA to participate in Operation FOSTER. The 2nd Battalion, 3d Marines used 2/5's special services building as a COC. In addition, the messhall, showers, billeting areas and other camp facilities were made available to the officers and men of 2/3. Members of the battalion indicated that during their ten day stay they enjoyed better facilities than they had at any other time during their tour as the SLF.

d. On 20 November, the AN HOA airfield was temporarily closed for repairs. The SeaBees immediately initiated repair work and indicated that the runway would be re-opened within 10 days. It was.

2. Supply.

a. On 1 November, the Division Supply Inspecting Team, a part of the Command Material Management Inspection Team, inspected Battalion Supply. Supply was found to be in satisfactory condition with discrepancies. Later in the month the Battalion Supply was inspected by the Division Fiscal Section. Again, supply was given a satisfactory rating with two minor discrepancies.

b. During Operation ESSEX, Battalion Supply maintained a 24 hour watch at the Collecting and Clearing Station that was established at the Battalion Aid Station. As casualties arrived from the field their 782 gear and weapons were collected by supply personnel. Items of 782 gear were returned to supply where they were inspected for serviceability. Serviceable gear was washed at the LSU laundry and re-issued. Rifles were returned to the Battalion Armory where they were cleaned, inspected and returned to service. Over 150 individual weapons and approximately 75% of the 782 gear were recovered, reducing considerably what could have been an extremely high combat loss.

c. Supply conducted a warehouse inventory this month in an effort to reduce items of unnecessary equipment. Some items were found, and, in an effort to "lighten the load", they were dropped from the unit cargo manifest and marked for return to 1st Force Service Regiment.

d. Class II logistical support continued to show marked improvement during the month of November. Large amounts of 782 gear were received and made available for issue to Marines joining 2/5.

3. Motor Transport

a. On 1 November a lecture, followed by a discussion, was presented to the members of the motor transport section by the Assistant Motor Transport Officer. The topic centered around the methods of first and second echelon maintenance of the M-series vehicles.

b. Driver training classes were held for the M-274 (Mule) and M-422A1 (Mighty Mite) during November. Fifteen new Mule drivers and two new Mighty Mite drivers were licensed. At the conclusion of the courses, the newly licensed drivers and the members of the motor transport platoon were given a safe driving lecture.

c. To provide for increase control and security of the motor transport area, the motor transport personnel constructed a cement decked dispatch and records hut at the entrance to the motor pool.

d. Of the battalion's vehicles 92% are currently operational ready.

4. Engineers.

a. The 1st Engineers provided this Battalion with a ten man demolition team during Operation ESSEX.

b. Road sweeps continued to be conducted during the month of November. With one exception during the operation, when the road was swept to the south, all sweeps were conducted between AN HOA and PHU LAC (6). During the month approximately 30 mines and booby traps were found on Liberty Road between the aforementioned positions.

c. The engineers completed construction of the 28th and last bunker on 22 November. Excess building materials have been turned in to the 1st Engineer Battalion.

5. Communications

a. The message center received 1100 messages during the month of November and transmitted 200. Over 40% of the outgoing traffic was transmitted manually because the AN/GGC-3 (tape cutter) was at FSR for repairs. The AN/GGC-3 was returned to the Battalion late in the month and it is currently in operation. It provides the Battalion with faster more efficient communications. The message center was rewired during November. In addition with Romax Cable and the lighting system improved.

b. The wire section layed a five pair cable between the switchboard and the B.S in November. In addition, many of the cables in the CP area were replaced. On the battalion's perimeter, poles and new junction boxes were installed for the telephone lines which were previously on the ground.

c. The "tech" shop repaired 167 pieces of communications equipment during November. Throughout Operation ESSEX, the tech shop was able to keep 97% of the battalion's AN/PRC-25's in operation.

d. Sixty-eight new pieces of radio equipment were received through the supply system during the month. Three KY-136's and six KYK-12's (components of the KY-8) were turned in to the Division S&C. In addition, two KY-13's (shockproof mounts for the KY-8) were declassified by destroying the nomenclature tags on them.

6. Medicala. Significant Events.

(1) On 3 November, a medical support team was combined with BAS personnel for triage during Operation ESSEX. Utilizing BAS facilities, 292 patients were seen and treated in an average of seven minutes. Furthermore, a modified field kitchen was established to ensure all casualties received hot food and beverages.

(2) On 16 November, the BAS was utilized for Operation BADGER HUNT/FOSTER.

(3) Foot protective ointment for prevention of immersion foot was discontinued by the Regimental Commander.

W. Civil Affairs/Civic Action.

1. General. During this reporting period, 2/5 S-5 assisted 2/3 and 29th CA Company in relocating 7,921 refugees from Operations ESSEX and FOSTER, in THANH MY Refugee Settlement, DUC DUC District. In all, 27½ tons of rice was captured in both operations, bagged in rice bags provided by the 2/5 S-5, and turned over to DUC DUC District. Although operational commitments of this Battalion precluded the conduct of any Med Caps, the BAS Vietnamese Dispensary picked up the slack in treating 345 Vietnamese Nationals. S-5 also supported the Vietnamese Independence Day Festival at DUC DUC District on 1 November.

2. MISSION. 2nd Bn 5th Marines (-) (Rein) conducts heliborne assault followed by S&D operations in the ANTENNA VALLEY area in order to capture or destroy enemy caches, installations and material, disrupt command Hq functions, obtain intelligence, and to kill or capture enemy forces.

1. SUMMARY OF ENEMY SITUATION.

a. The general area of operation within ANTENNA VALLEY may contain elements of the 31st NVA, and 1 VC Regt and an unknown number of local guerrillas. Reliable intelligence reports indicate considerable enemy movement in the eastern portion of ANTENNA VALLEY. Information derived from intelligence sources provide fairly conclusive Order of Battle Information on the area of operations. This has been an enemy controlled area for several years and with a Marine operation in that area in Dec 1966 and operations in 1967 taking approximately 3000 refugees from that area, the enemy probably continues to have the usual logistics, propaganda, political and other support activities. Aerial photos and intelligence information indicate that the enemy has constructed fortifications such as bunkers and trench-lines and foxholes. Should a Division or Regimental type headquarters be located in the eastern portion of ANTENNA VALLEY, it is likely the enemy will defend the area vigorously with forces available and attempt to reinforce from adjacent areas.

b. Enemy Units.







Annex F (Flood Contingency Plan) to Operation Order 27-67 (Operation ESSEX)

Time Zone: H

1. SITUATION.

- a. SONG THU BON. As demonstrated during the flood of 8-10 Oct 1967 this river has the capability of rising more than 30 feet within twenty-four hours. The river overflowed its banks and completely inundated low lying terrain (below the 10-meter contour line) for miles around. At the same time its' current appeared to be moving between 10 and 20 knots. This river flows from south to north along the western edge of ANTENNA VALLEY. The water level dropped equally as fast once its peak surge had been reached. It should be noted that once the rains stopped the river continued to rise for approximately twelve hours.
- b. ANTENNA VALLEY. Streams flowing down out of the hills surrounding ANTENNA VALLEY converge into one stream flowing from southeast to northeast emptying into the SONG THU BON. During dry periods the streams throughout the valley are passable to foot troops. During heavy rains, however, many of these streams flowing down out of the hills will become swift and deep. These streams plus the main drainage streams on the valley floor can become considerable barriers to foot traffic if not impassable. When the SONG THU BON overflowed its banks the water backed well up into ANTENNA VALLEY. Appendix 1 (Flood Overlay).

2. MISSION. Operation Order 27-67

3. EXECUTION.

a. Concept of operation.

- (1) The concept of Operation ESSEX calls for detailed search of the hills surrounding ANTENNA VALLEY. As such the Companies operating in the search zones should not be affected greatly by flood waters. The Battalion Command Group located on top of Hill 170 will not be affected. Co M 3rd Bn 5th Marines upon arrival Objective B will also be located on high terrain. Two critical problems to the success of Operation ESSEX can develop from flood waters:


- (a) Delay of Phase I of Operation ESSEX (initial entry of units into AO).
- (b) Isolation of units during Phase II and Phase III.

- (2) Delay of Phase I of Operation ESSEX. A determination will be made prior to 0400 D-Day by the Battalion Commander as to whether to execute or delay the operation. A recommendation for delay will be submitted to the Commanding General for approval.
- (3) Isolation of units during Phase II and Phase III.
- (a) Upon start of heavy rains or weather forecast that indicates flood level may be reached the zone search will continue, however, the Battalion Reserve Company will be positioned within the zone of one of the search companies on high ground above the flood level so that water barriers will not prevent employment.
- (b) Rifle Companies operating in search zones will ensure that patrol bases and patrol routes are established in locations where swollen streams will not inundate bases or isolate units.
- (c) Rifle Companies will be prepared to move laterally into adjacent search zones to assist each other in the event that water barriers prevent maneuver of the Bn Reserve.
- b. Rifle Companies. Upon receipt of flood warning:
- (1) Ensure patrol bases are located in such position that swollen streams or flood waters will not inundate patrol bases.
- (2) Be prepared to move laterally into adjacent search zones to assist adjacent rifle companies.
- c. Battalion Reserve. Upon receipt of flood warning:
- (1) Recall all local patrols immediately.
- (2) Be prepared for movement to position within search zone as designated. Appendix 1 (Detailed Search Plan Overlay) of Annex E (Detailed Search Plan).

- (2) Control & delivery. Helicopter delivery daily. Requests thru HST. First resupply on D+1.
- (3) Supplies available. Resupply code list distributed separately by Bn S-4. Order supplies by line number where applicable.
- (4) Alternate resupply method. Pre-loaded Amtracs to be positioned at base of Hill 170 with Co M 3/5. If terrain precludes movement of Amtracs to this position they will be based at the NONG SON combat base on call to move to road junction western edge of ANTENNA VALLEY (AT 857401). - (5) Bn Cnd Post Forward. Supplies to be delivered upon initial entry in LZ DOVE. Appendix 2 (LZ DOVE Supplies).
- (6) Aerial Delivery. Emergency resupply IAW Div AdminO 30L-67.
- (7) Water. Primary means of water resupply is from local streams. Minimum 2 halizone tablets per canteen directed.

2. EVACUATION.

- a. BAS AN HOA (AT 875472) has been reinforced by 1st Med Bn Shock/Surgical Team for duration of operation.
- b. Priority medevacs will be directed to DA NANG. Head wounds to DA NANG NSA Hospital. Other wounds to 1st Med Bn.
- c. Emergency medevacs will be directed to BAS AN HOA.
- d. Extraction of medevacs from Area of Operation.
 - (1) Concept of Operation ESSEX calls for intensive search of mountain terrain a good portion of which is covered by jungle canopy. In order to ensure successful extraction of casualties from such terrain pre-planning and close attention of certain details must be paid by all unit commanders.
 - (2) PRE-SELECTION OF HELICOPTER LZ'S. As units move through the mountains and jungle canopy potential LZ's for medevac extraction MUST BE NOTED AND DESIGNATED much the same as rally points on a patrol. Time permitting LZ's should be improved as units pass through. Report all potential LZ's to this Hq (S-3). Report location by thrust point. LZ should be selected for H-34 type helicopters.
 - (3) As casualties occur they will be carried to the closest pre-selected LZ.
 - (4) Extraction through canopy. In the event that no LZ is available an extraction through the canopy can be considered. Cable and hoist equipment on H-34 helicopters will enable extraction through canopy LESS THAN 50 to 70 feet high. Penetration equipment is not readily available therefore some effort must be made to open a hole through the canopy such as blowing down one or more large trees by demolitions, thus permitting the sling to be lowered. Control/marketing of the extraction point is also critical. Radio description and talk down alone has proven insufficient on recent operations. Smoke can be employed and is recommended. Extraction through canopy is a highly dangerous technique and should only be requested when movement to a pre-selected helo LZ can not be reached in sufficient time to allow saving of an emergency medevac life.
- e. Malaria. Antenna Valley has been one of the highest malaria belts in the DA NANG TAOR. Company Commanders will ensure that all

troops take their malaria pills, carry at least 2 bottles of insect repellent and roll down sleeves at sundown.

- f. Immersion Foot. Previous operations in ANTENNA VALLEY during monsoon seasons have suffered many casualties from immersion foot. Company Commanders will ensure that troops take extra socks, air their feet frequently and use foot powder. Designated personnel carry 5 days supply of silicone to the field. Company Commanders submit request for additional 5 days on D+3.
3. TRANSPORTATION. Priority/emergency transportation of individuals from/to the Area of Operation will be accomplished by helicopter. Submit requests through HST.
 4. SERVICE. Submit requests for replacement of combat essential equipment through HST.
 5. PERSONNEL.
 - a. Strengths. Rifle Company Commanders report field strengths to the Bn S-4 at AN HOA prior to D-Day departure from AN HOA. Report changes through HST ~~as they occur~~.
 - b. Replacements. Return of personnel to field units by helicopter during resupply. Company rear echelons submit request to HST AN HOA.
 - c. Prisoners of War. Forward POW's/Detainees to Bn S-2 rep at Hill 170 (AT 888382). Request helicopter transportation thru HST.
 - d. Morale and Personnel Services.
 - (1) Mail. Company Rear Echelons forward mail to field units through HST AN HOA.
 - (2) Marine Corps Birthday. Cake and ice cream will be delivered to field units by helicopter.
 - e. Civil Affairs. Appendix 3 (Civil Affairs).
 - f. Casualty Reporting. Report casualties by line number to Bn Cnd Group on Hill 170 over the Bn Tac Net. Rifle Companies ensure that two (2) correct copies of the casualty lists are delivered to Bn S-1 prior to 0600 on D-Day.
 6. MISCELLANEOUS.
 - a. Uniform and equipment. Jungle utilities, helmets with cover, green side out. Cartridge belts, with two canteens w/covers, jungle kits, gas masks w/waterproof bags, magazine and grenade pouches, light marching pack w/entrenching tools, ponchos. Flak jackets will not be worn. Normal arms will be carried.

5. Task Organization: See Annex A (Task Organization) of Enclosure (1).

6. Supporting Arms.

a. Air:

(1) 6 Nov 67 - Close air support was provided by eight sections (sixteen sorties) of F4 and A4 type aircraft. Most ordnance was dropped on a fortified village that was occupied by Company G the next day. Company G Commander reported extensive bomb damage to the village. One section of A4 aircraft sprayed CS gas but due to a malfunction in the dispenser, the results were quite poor. Other ordnance used was 250 lb G.P. bombs, fire bombs, and 20mm cannon. Four observation missions were utilized to direct close air support, adjust artillery and provide aerial observation. Spooky gun ships and flare ships provided outstanding support throughout the night.

(2) 7 Nov 67 - Eight sections of F4's and A4's (sixteen sorties) provided close air support. (One section of A4's dispensed CS gas, but by time the gas reached ground level it was widely dispersed and had little effect.) The ordnance delivered by the other flights consisted of 250 and 500 lb G.P. bombs, fire bombs, and 20mm cannon. The target coverage was generally quite effective. Five aerial observation missions were used to control close air support and observe enemy movement. Two HU1E helicopters were utilized on an APD mission with several positive plottings recorded.

(3) 8 Nov 67 - Three sections (six sorties) of F4's and A4's provided close air support. Fortified villages were struck with good target coverage. Ordnance consisted of 250 lb G.P. bombs, fire bombs, and 20mm cannon. Three observation missions were utilized for detection of enemy movement and control of fixed wing. Two flare ships were used during the hours of darkness with good coverage.

(4) 9 Nov 67 - Two sections of A4's (four sorties) delivered 250 lb G.P. bombs and fire bombs into a fortified village with good coverage of target. Two HU1E helicopters expended 76 2.75 rockets into a suspected enemy position. Four observation missions were utilized.

(5) 10 Nov 67 - Weather precluded use of tactical air.

(6) 11 Nov 67 - Seven sections of F8's, F4's, and A4's (fourteen sorties) were utilized for close air support. These delivered 250 and 500 lb G.P. bombs, fire bombs, and 20mm cannon on fortified enemy positions. Two HU1E gun ships fired 28 2.75 rockets into fortified positions. Six observation flights were flown.

(7) 12 Nov 67 - One section of F4's (two sorties) delivered 250 lb bombs and 20mm cannon fire on fortified positions with good target coverage. Four observation missions were flown.

(8) 13 Nov 67 - No tactical air used.

(9) 14 Nov 67 - No tactical air used.

(10) 15 Nov 67 - Requested an A/O to be on station but received only one observation mission for 30 minutes.

(11) 16 Nov 67 - Four sections and one single aircraft flight (9 sorties) of A4's, F4's, and F8's provided close air support delivering 250 lb G.P. bombs, fire bombs, rockets, CBU's, and 20mm cannon fire on a fortified village objective. The CBU's (10 cannisters) all seemed to malfunction. Six cannisters did not open until impact and the other four opened at low altitude with very little spread of the bomblets. There was a very high dud rate on the CBU's. The other four flights were controlled by the ALO and all provided good target coverage. Three observation missions were utilized.

(12) 17 Nov 67 - The ALO controlled one section of F4's delivering 250 lb G.P. bombs and fire bombs on an enemy position that had fired at a friendly helicopter. The F4's provided good area coverage with their ordnance.

(13) Generally, the tactical fixed wing support was reasonably effective. Approximately 75% of the ordnance went into the target area. Two hundred and fifty pound G.P. bombs (retarded and unretarded) and fire bombs destroyed or damaged all surface structures in their proximity but did little damage to holes and tunnels. Larger, hard ordnance, could not be used because of the short distance of targets from friendly units. At times it was difficult to get an aerial observation aircraft. When units were in contact, however, an observation aircraft was either on station or provided shortly. These men did an excellent job in controlling fixed wing close air support, adjusting artillery and spotting enemy movement.

The battalion was provided a Helicopter Support Team so the TACP did not concern itself with resupply or med-evacs but did attempt to request and inform the HST of helicopter availability. Although the battalion was promised two working aircraft during daylight hours such was not the case. On at least three days helicopters could not be provided for resupply. On these days helicopters in the AN HOA area on other missions volunteered to fly the resupply. Helicopter support, other than med-evacs, was very poor because of the non-availability of aircraft.

Battalion level was more than adequate. Infantry companies were prompt in reporting their positions. Artillery and air personnel coordinated med-evacs/resupply requests, while at the same time allowing for speedy recommencement of artillery fires once the missions were completed. The supporting batteries provided outstanding service in answering calls while concurrently attending to those units of 2/5 not directly associated with the operation.

The two participating FSCC's worked closely for the quick clearance of all fires.

7. Intelligence.

a. Enemy strength in the area of operation was carried by G-2, 1st Marine Division, and S-2, 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines to include elements of the 3rd NVA Regiment, and 1 unidentified battalion as well as an unknown number of guerrillas.

b. Information obtained from villagers, refugees, detainees, and prisoners of war indicated that the 46th Company of the 21st NVA Regiment had been located vicinity (AT924358) for 3 days prior to 8 Nov 67. It is significant to note that on 2 Nov an NVA returnee from the 21st Regiment surrendered to 2/5 and stated that the 21st Regiment was located in the QUE SON area vicinity (BT0625). A PW captured on 14 Nov vicinity (AT929367) stated that he was from the 1st Battalion, 55th Regiment, 134th NVA Division. It was later determined that this Regiment and Division are still in NVN. A VC coolie laborer, detained on 10 Nov, stated that there had been 3 companies of NVA, led by TRAN TRONG HOANG, located at (AT882358) on 9 Nov. No information available at this command of TRAN TRONG HOANG prior to this engagement.

c. Enemy contacts were with units of estimated (20) men to 3 companies in strength. Company "H" made contact on 6 Nov with an estimated 3 companies (150-200 NVA) in a heavily fortified village vicinity (AT913383). On 8 Nov Company "M" 3rd Battalion, 5th Marines made contact vicinity (AT905363) with an estimated 3 NVA companies in a heavily fortified village. Tactics employed by the enemy were; defense of a heavily fortified position, allowing the friendly troops to move into the killing zone before opening fire. When Marines established contact, the enemy employed a delaying action to enable larger or reserve elements to slip out from the battle zone.

d. On 7 Nov Companies "G" and "H", located vicinity (AT913383), received approximately 38 rounds of unidentified artillery or mortars. The rounds appeared to be HE mixed with approximately 6 rounds irritant gas. Marines who were effected reported a burning sensation in the eyes and the nose. The irritant gas employed by the enemy, was suspected to be CS, however, since CS gas had been employed both on 6 Nov and 7 Nov in the same vicinity it is possible that the sensation experienced was caused by residual effects of that strike. The artillery or mortars appeared to have been fired from a maximum range, at (1) to (3) minute intervals and was estimated to be 120mm or 105mm.

e. The hamlets and villages in the area are characterized by interlocking trenchlines, fighting holes, and bunkers. On 7 Nov, a tunnel was discovered, vicinity (AT915394), that was approximately (25) meters in length and (8) feet wide in the largest part. On 8 Nov, a tunnel was found, vicinity (AT905363), with an entrance that went down (15) feet and then extended parrallel (90) feet with (4) rooms approximately (8x10) feet in size.

f. The Battalion CP located on Hill 170, (AT888383), monitored an enemy radio that transmitted Vietnamese and Cantonese Chinese. (Freqs monitored have been turned over to G-2). It is believed that there were some Chinese advisors in the NVA ranks.

g. Information obtained from detainees indicated that the VC carried the wounded enemy troops to SON PHUC Village, vicinity (AT900387). A Vietnamese male refugee stated that there was a trail running south from vicinity (AT915352) to (AT920320). He also stated there was a unit CP located vicinity (AT918318), and a Regimental Headquarters located vicinity (AT908-322) which had a large radio with generator. A VC coolie led the intelligence personnel to a grave site, vicinity (AT902373), and uncovered 6 bodies of NVA troops dressed in green utilities with no marking of unit designation or individual names. The bodies were reportedly buried approximately 7 Nov. These remains were interred during a fire fight in neat graves with small mounds. The remains were in a prone position approximately 1 to 1½ feet below the surface of the ground in wooden caskets, with (2x6) feet planks on top. Small headstones of soft brick were placed on each grave with the names, CHAT, VOI, and THU thereon. No names appeared on the other three.

h. The terrain in the area of the operation was flat (rice paddies) with treelines around the villages, and along the streams. The area within the villages is dominated by trees, hedgerows, and heavy foilage, affording good concealment from the air. The high ground on each side of the valley is covered with trees and heavy foilage. Village fortifications included thin posts with three to six strands of well camouflaged barbed wire. Streams and trenches branched out from the fortified villages. There were also numerous family bomb shelters.

Leaflet drops and aerial broadcasts were conducted on 13 and 16 Nov, harassing the enemy with "surrender appeals and the government's Show of Force".

10. Execution.

On 30 October 1967, 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines received a warning order from CG, 1st Marine Division to be prepared to commence Operation ESSEX between 4 and 6 November. CG, 1st Mar Div Frag Order 149-67 (Operation ESSEX) was received on 2 November 1967. 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines Operation Order 27-67 was issued on 4 November 1967.

At 051139H, 1st Platoon, Company "E", with engineers attached, moved on foot from the NONG SON Combat Base, (AT822388), to LZ DOVE, (AT888382), with the mission to sweep and secure the LZ prior to the insertion of 2/5 CP on D-Day.

At 060500H, Company "M" moved on foot from AN HOA Combat Base, (AT875475), to Phase Line Red, (AT865412-AT863360), preparatory to launching the attack on Objective B, (AT837589).

At 060500H, Company "G" departed from NONG SON Combat Base and moved on foot to Phase Line Red preparatory to launching the attack on Objective C, (AT888-375).

At 060700H, a Platoon from Company "F" w/Engr road sweep team departed AN HOA Combat Base and escorted 6 Amtracs (4th Plat Co A 3rd Amtrac Bn) in trace of Company "M" to vicinity Check Point # 4, (AT856400). The platoon from Company "F" returned to the AN HOA Combat Base while the Amtrac Unit linked up with Company "M".

At 060800H, Operation ESSEX commenced. Company "G" crossed Phase Line Red in the attack on Objective C, (AT887375).

At 060927H, Company "H" made a heliborn landing into and secured LZ RAVEN, (AT904386). The landing was unopposed.

At 060947H, Company "D" made an unopposed landing into LZ RAVEN and moved in the attack in Zone 2, Objective E, (AT914396). When all Company "D" units were clear of the landing zone CO 2/5 ordered Company "H" into the attack in Zone 3, Objective F, (AT922382).

At 061008H, Company M moved across Phase Line Red in the attack on Objective B, (AT886389).

At 061015H, 2/5 CP with a section of 81mm Mortars and a section of 106 Recoilles Rifles landed in LZ DOVE. The 1st Platoon, Company E, which had secured the zone on 5 Nov., provided CP security.

At 061130H, Company H engaged an estimated 2 companies of NVA well dug in in a heavily fortified village vicinity (AT913384). Incoming fires consisted of S/A, A/W, and 60mm mortar fire. Company H continued the assault closing to within 7-10 meters of enemy positions before heavy casualties and camouflaged barbed wire fence slowed the attack. While Marine units assaulted enemy positions fixed wing air strikes and intense artillery fires were poured into the village.

At 061145H, CO 2/5 ordered Company G and Company M to advance rapidly to the east to assist Company H. When it became apparent that Company G would arrive at a position of tactical advantage prior to Company M, Company M was directed to resume the reserve mission.

At 061210H, CO 2/5 requested the BALD EAGLE be moved to a 15 minute alert status. The request was fulfilled.

At 061215H, CO 2/5 requested fixed wing aircraft with CS gas to be sprayed on enemy positions, while Company H renewed the attack. Fixed wing aircraft arrived on station at 061345H but were carrying smoke rather than gas. CO 2/5 again requested CS gas to be delivered by fixed wing aircraft but it failed to arrive until 061800H.

At 061600H, Company G arrived at Company H's position, moved behind them and assaulted the enemy position through Company H's right flank. At the onset Company G came under heavy enemy fire from both flanks and to their front. Fixed wing aircraft and artillery continued to hammer the enemy positions. At 061800H fixed wing aircraft sprayed CS gas over both Companies G and H, as well as enemy positions. All Marine personnel were wearing protective gas masks. It was planned that Company G would assault the village through the gas while Company H provided the base of fire. The gas, however, never settled to the ground and proved to be highly ineffective. Despite the poor effect of the gas, Company G went into the assault and effected a slight penetration. Strong enemy resistance and the lateness of the hour precluded exploitation of the penetration. Companies G and H consolidated their positions and attempted to evacuate dead and wounded. Heavy enemy fire, however, made evacuation impossible until after dark. Sporadic small arms, grenades, and mortar fire continued throughout the night. At 062245H, Spooky aircraft and a flareship arrived on station. Results: USMC KIA 23, USMC WL 56, NVA KIA (CONF) 35, NVA KIA (PROB) 24.

At 062215H, Company M, vicinity (AT886389), received 2 rounds HE of unknown origin within its perimeter. Results: USMC WL (MINOR) 2.

At 070615H, Company G moved to assault the fortified village following extensive prep fires including 8" rounds with delay fuses. Company D, vicinity (AT908393), blocked to the north. The assault was unopposed.

At 070837H, Company G vicinity (AT913382) received sniper fire from vicinity (AT913383). Small arms fire was returned and the sweep continued.

At 071147H, Company G, vicinity (AT913383) came under attack by indirect fire of unknown origin and remained under attack until 071311H. 32 rounds of HE and 6 rounds of suspected irritant gas, (subsequent evaluation indicates these rounds were probably smoke) suspected to be 120mm mortar or 105mm artillery, impacted in the Company G positions. Counter battery fires were fired and air strikes conducted on all areas of likely gun positions but the exact location of the enemy guns was never determined. When the attack lifted, Company G moved to and siezed Obj F (AT922383). Results: USMC WIA (EVAC) 2.

Company D attacked to vicinity (AT920394). Company H completed the evacuation of dead and wounded and moved to (AT883388). Company M attacked east towards Obj G (AT832372). Company M received sporadic sniper fire throughout the day.

At 071804H, Company M engaged an estimated NVA company in a fortified village, (AT922372), receiving small arms, automatic weapons and 60mm mortar fires. A heavy volume of fire was returned and artillery fire missions requested. Darkness, however, precluded continuation of the ground attack and Company M moved to (AT919378) setting in defensive positions. Artillery missions were fired into the village throughout the night. Results: USMC KIA 1, USMC WIA 3, NVA KIA (PROB) 4.

At 080300H, Company M moved to an attack position (AT921375). At 080709H, Company M swept into the fortified village, Obj A, (AT917376), and met with negative resistance. A search of the village revealed numerous items of equipment, including 1 RPD lt MG as well as the bodies of 4 NVA KIA indicating that the enemy had fled in great haste. In addition to the 4 bodies, many blood pools and trails of blood were found indicating heavy enemy casualties. The village was heavily fortified. Results: NVA KIA (CONF) 4, NVA KIA (PROB) 50. Detainees 6.

In conjunction with Company M's assault, Company G attacked to the south and seized Obj Z (AT922352). Company D remained in the vicinity (AT928387), conducted a detailed search of that area and then attacked south toward Obj G. Company H moved to Obj A in trace of Company M, while Company M continued the assault to Obj T (AT913366). Company M received sniper fire throughout the day.

At 081112H, Recon Patrol Lunga Point, located vicinity (AT915417), observed VC planting booby traps in the vicinity (AT910392). An artillery mission was requested and fired with excellent coverage. Results: VC KIA (PROB) 8.

At 081210H, Company M, vicinity (AT916366), having taken Obj T, continued the attack to Obj X (AT904362) and received sporadic fire. Company M returned fire and requested an 81mm mortar mission, while continuing the drive into the Obj area. The enemy broke contact and withdrew to the south. Results: USMC KIA 1.

At 081245H, Company G apprehended 1 NVA POW vicinity (AT914358). Results: NVA POW 1.

At 081300H, Company D, vicinity (AT927396), observed 2 VC with weapons at (AT928396). Company D took the VC under fire killing one and wounding the other. The wounded VC escaped with both weapons. Results: VC KIA CONF 1, VC WIA 1.

At 081340H, a Company M Marine tripped a booby trap of estimated 155mm size in vicinity (AT911365). Results: USMC KIA 1, USMC WIA (EVAC) 4.

At 081700H, Company H moved into and swept Obj T, vicinity (AT913369). A fresh grave was located and dug up revealing 1 NVA KIA. Results: NVA KIA (CONF) 1.

At 081707H, CO Company M erroneously reported his unit location vicinity (AT905362) which indicated he was on Obj X. (It was later determined that his true location was vicinity (AT909366).) At 081708H CO Company M reported establishing contact with enemy located vicinity (AT905365), and that 3 Marines were wounded and 3 pinned down. At that time CO Company M requested the assistance of Company H. The request was denied because reports indicated only 3 wounded Marines. It was suggested by CO 2/5 that Company M attempt to envelope the enemy positions. Prior to Company M's launching the attack 182 rounds of 155mm and 8" HE as well as 3 fixed wing air strikes hammered the suspected enemy positions. At 081717H Company M reported receiving fire from their rear. At 081815H CO Company M reported they would be ready to move into the attack when the last air strike lifted. (Air strikes accounted for 5 NVA KIA (CONF).) At 081827H Company M reported incoming mortars. At 081853H Company M reported incoming mortars, small arms and automatic weapons fire from all sides. Company M remained in heavy contact until 082130H. In the confusion of heavy enemy resistance and oncoming darkness the Marine unit became separated and lost all maneuverability. Heavy casualties were reported. Because of an almost total breakdown in communications between CO Company M and his subordinate unit commanders. An accurate determination of their situation could not be reached until approximately 082130H. (In light of poor communications, CO 2/5 delayed committal of adjacent units.) At 082157 Company H started to the Company M position. While Company H moved to assist Company M, "box me in" artillery fires were fired around friendly units as enemy movement on the battle field was reported. A flare ship was called on station and provided battle illumination while Company M attempted to consolidate its position. At 090044H Company H established contact with Company M. Artillery fires were fired into the fortified village throughout the night. Results: USMC KIA 11, USMC WIA 44, NVA KIA (CONF) 6, NVA KIA (PROB) 47.

At first light 9 Nov Company D moved to join Companies HandM on Obj T, while fixed wing air strikes and artillery fires pounded Obj X. Companies G and H remained in position while Company M continued to consolidate and reorganize.

At 091000H, Company D flank security elements, located vicinity (AT907370) observed 6 enemy with weapons apparently setting a claymore mine. The enemy observed the advancing Marines and fled dropping the mine and one K-44 automatic rifle.

At 091120H, recon unit Pony Boy, located vicinity (AT957367) observed 4 VC moving along a trail vicinity (AT929367). An artillery fire mission was requested and fired with outstanding coverage. Results: VC KIA (PROB) 2.

Company D moved into Obj X, after conducting a recon of avenues of approach, and found the village to be heavily fortified but undefended. Extensive search of the village was conducted by Company D. Companies H and M remained in position while Company G moved to (AT921367). On the evening of 9 Nov. Company M was reinforced by 1 platoon from Company I, 3rd Battalion, 5th Marines.

At 100730H Companies G, H and M attacked west to Objs 2 (AT902371), 3 (AT900365) and 4 (AT897360) respectively. All Objs were subjected to extensive artillery prep fires.

At 100930H, Company D, while continuing the search of Obj X, vicinity (AT906363) located 1 AK-47 rifle and 3 fresh graves. Results: NVA KIA (CONF) 3. Detainees 3.

At 100930H, recon unit Lucky Lark vicinity (AT878386) observed 2 VC move into hut, Vicinity (AT894370). An artillery mission was fired with outstanding coverage. Results: VC KIA (PROB) 2.

At 101200H, Company D attacked west to Obj 1 (AT892363). During Company D's sweep, 1 VN detainee was apprehended who stated that 180 NVA with Chinese advisors had engaged Company M and that they had moved out of the area of contact with 60 dead and wounded.

At 101630H, Company M, while conducting a detailed search of the area, vicinity (AT887360) located 1 NVA KIA CONF. Results: NVA KIA (CONF) 1.

On 11 Nov, CO 2/5 shifted the direction of the attack to the southeast, moving Company D through the high ground toward Obj D (AT901348) with Company M in trace. Company G attack to and seized the high ground vicinity Obj G (AT921354) while Company H attacked toward Obj H (AT916355) in trace of Company G.

At 110900H, The Company G point man, observed one VC vicinity (AT977364) attempting to escape the advancing Marines, and took him under fire. Results: VC KIA (CONF) 1.

At 111135H, the Company D point man observed an NVA soldier vicinity (AT883353) attempting to escape the advancing Marines. The Marine point fired 1 shot. Results: NVA KIA (CONF) 1.

At 111350H, recon unit Senator located vicinity (AT914418) observed 6 VC with weapons moving along a trail vicinity (AT908385). An artillery fire mission was requested and fired with outstanding coverage. Results: VC KIA (PROB) 3.

Company G maintained surveillance of Obj H observing frequent enemy movement. Company H reached the Obj area just prior to dusk, and, suspecting it to be another fortified village, held up for the night while the area was saturated by artillery fires and fixed wing air strikes. Heavy canopy slowed the movement of Companies G and M and darkness forced them to merge and set in vicinity (AT891354). Artillery fires continued to pound Obj D throughout the night.

On the afternoon of 11 Nov the insertion of a recon unit in the high ground south of the operational area was aborted as the intended area of insertion was within an area assigned to the Americal Division by a change of the AO.

At 111950H, a Company M ambush moving out into position observed 10 NVA moving along a trail vicinity (AT891355). The ambush took the enemy under fire and observed 8 fall. A search of the area, although it did not result in the discovery of the bodies, revealed several distinct drag marks. Further search at first light failed to reveal additional evidence of enemy casualties. Results: NVA KIA (CONF) 8.

At 120355H, a Company M ambush position vicinity (AT891352) was probed by an unknown number of enemy employing 2 grenades and S/A fire. The ambush was extracted and artillery fires brought to bear on the suspected enemy positions. Results: USMC WIA 2.

On 12 Nov, CO 2/5 directed Company G to release one platoon to the OPCON of Company H to assist in the attack on the suspected fortified village. Company G(-) provided fire support from the high ground vicinity Obj G for Company H's move. Companies D and M continued east to Objectives D and M.

At 121100H, Company H siezed Obj H in an unopposed assault. A search of the area led to the discovery of slaughtered livestock indicating recent enemy occupation. The village, although moderately fortified, was not defended. At 121130H, Company H returned the OPCON of the Company G platoon to that company.

At 121200H, recon unit Lucky Lark, located vicinity (AT893382), observed 2 VC moving into a hut vicinity (AT894370). An artillery mission was fired with outstanding coverage. Results: VC KIA (PROB) 2.

At 121745H Company D, moving in the vicinity (AT903354), observed 4 VC with weapons running away from the advancing Marines. The VC were taken under fire and one was observed to fall and lie motionless. Two escaped while the third dragged off the body. Results: VC KIA (CONF) 1.

At 122100H, a Company H listening post located vicinity (AT916356) observed 2 enemy moving along a trail. Marines took the enemy under fire with S/A and grenades. One grenade was observed to land between the two enemy. The listening post was returned to friendly lines and an artillery mission was called in on the area of the sighting. Results: VC KIA (PROB) 2.

At 130020H a Company H ambush vicinity (AT916354) received 3 enemy sniper rounds into its position from vicinity (AT915354). Fire, including S/A and LAWS was returned in the direction of suspected enemy positions. Results: USMC WIA 1.

On the morning of 13 Nov Companies D and M moved to and secured Obj M at (AT908351) without incident. Company G remained in position and conducted platoon patrols to the southeast and east while Company H remained in position and conducted platoon patrols to the east and west.

At 131430H a recon patrol left 2/5 GP and moved to vicinity (AT892386), a suspected area of VC activity. Results: 1 detainee.

At 132145H a Company G listening post located vicinity (AT921347) observed 1 VC and received 1 incoming grenade. Marines returned grenades and 60mm mortar fire driving the enemy from the area. Results: USMC WIA 1.

On 14 Nov, all companies attacked to the north and then swung east. Company D attacked north to vicinity (AT905367) and drove east to Obj G (AT933374). Company G attacked north to vicinity (AT924360) and pushed east to Obj L (AT938362). Company H attacked north to vicinity (AT919364) and then moved east to Obj K (AT933365). Company M, moved north to vicinity (AT908363) and then moved east joining Company H on Obj K. Company D conducted search operations in zone 4, Company H in zone 5 and Company G in zone 6.

At 141115H, Company D, moving in the vicinity (AT904365), observed and apprehended 2 young men in a village. Results: Detainees 1, POW 1.

At 141145H, Company H, moving in the vicinity (AT920365), observed 2 VN males running away from the advancing Marines. Warning shots were fired; 1 man stopped and was apprehended. Results: NVA POW 1

At 141130H Company G, moving in vicinity (AT930359), observed 4 VC in vicinity (AT930360). The VC were taken under fire and one was observed to fall. A search of the area led to the discovery of several packs and assorted documents. Results: VC KIA (PROB) 1.

At 141430H a Company E platoon(-) swept through the village vicinity (AT392386). Results: Detainees 4.

On 14 Nov Company M evacuated 58 refugees from the battle area.

On 15 Nov, Company D commenced the attack toward Obj C (AT901366), while Company G and Company H launched a coordinated attack on Obj A (AT912384). Company M moved to Obj C and tied in with Company D.

At 151145H, recon unit Thin Man located vicinity (AT914416) observed 5 VC with weapons moving along a stream vicinity (AT914403), and fired an artillery mission with excellent coverage. Results: VC KIA (PROB) 2

During the afternoon of 15 Nov Companies G and H moved into Obj A and conducted a detailed but fruitless search for duds or fuses of the suspected artillery/mortars employed by the enemy on 7 Nov. On completion of the search, CO 2/5 ordered Companies G and H to move to (AT908388) and set in for the night.

During the day 138 refugees were evacuated from the battle area.

At first light 16 Nov Company D moved to and searched Obj E (AT900380) meeting with negative enemy resistance. Company M moved in trace and assisted Company D with search. At the completion of the search Company D moved to Obj G (AT887388) and Company M moved to vicinity 2/5 CP (AT887383). Companies G and H continued the drive west, launching a coordinated attack across PL King (AT901390-AT917403) to Objectives B (AT904396) and C (AT895390). Company G secured Obj B and held while Company H moved through and took Obj C. Both companies then continued in the attack, siezing and occupying Obj D (AT888396). Company G evacuated 62 refugees.

At 170800H Operation ESSEX terminated. Companies D and H moved to vicinity 2/5 CP for helilift with Company M and Command Group to AN HOA Combat Base. Company G moved overland to the western edge of the valley, linked up with AmTracs and moved to AN HOA.

At 170800H Company D was chopped to OPCON of 1st Battalion, 5th Marines.

At 170800H Company M and one platoon of Company I was chopped to OPCON of 3rd Battalion, 5th Marines.

12. Administration and Logistics

(a) Supply

(1) All requests for resupply were submitted to the Logistics Support Unit at AN HOA. There was a Helicopter Support Team at the LSU and another one with the CP group on Hill 170. In addition, an HST of three men accompanied each company. After the LSU brought the requested supplies to the airfield the Helicopter Support Teams insured that they reached their proper destinations.

(2) The S-4 resupply team pre-loaded six LVT's with supplies, which were sent to the field with the battalion. The supplies were to be used if weather conditions precluded helicopter resupply.

(3) Battalion Supply provided items to the units in the field that the LSU did not have in stock. These, for the most part, were items of 782 gear. Supply also recovered 782 gear and weapons as they arrived with the battalion's casualties. The 782 gear was washed, repaired and reissued. Weapons were identified by serial number, cleaned, repaired and reissued.

(b) Maintenance. Normal PM of equipment was accomplished throughout the conduct of the operation. Ordnance spare parts were provided by the battalion armory. In addition, an armorer was sent to the field to perform limited technical inspections on weapons and to repair them.

(c) Treatment of Casualties and Hospitalization.

(1) At the start of Operation ESSEX on 6 Nov 1967, a medical support team was sent to the battalion aid station, 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines. The medical support team was composed of two medical officers, 2 chief petty officers, and 10 corpsmen. A field kitchen was also set up to insure that food was served to all patients, BAS personnel and the medical support team. Stretcher bearers were obtained from motor transport and the fourth platoon Co A, 3rd Amphibious Battalion personnel. There was a representative from battalion supply, 2nd Bn, 5th Mars to sort the 782 gear and weapons of the wounded personnel as they were received.

(2) During the operation a total of 242 patients were seen and treated. ~~Dead totaled~~ 37 USMC, 2 USMC DNH, and 4 Vietnamese scout-KIA. The breakdown of KIA's by company is as follows: Co H, 2nd Bn, 5th Mar 17; Co G, 2nd Bn, 5th Mar 6; H&S Co, 2nd Bn, 5th Mar 1; Co M, 3rd Bn, 5th Mar 14; Co D 1st Bn, 5th Mar 1. Of the 242 casualties there were 231 transfers to 1st Medical Battalion. Break down of the casualties is as follows: 120 battle casualties, 28 non-battle injuries and 37 disease. The most significant factor of disease transfers was immersion foot with a total of 61.

(3) From the 2nd Bn, 5th Marines there were 25 cases of immersion foot. The breakdown of the other companies is as follows: Co M 13 cases, Co I 3 cases. From Company D, 1st Bn, 5th Mar there were 20 cases of immersion foot.

(d) Transportation. Transportation of personnel and supplies was accomplished almost exclusively by helicopter. Since helicopters were busy evacuating casualties, resupply missions were run only after all casualties had been evacuated. At no time, however, was any company unable to function effectively due to lack of supplies. LVT's were used to transport one company and some supplies to the AO, however, the logistic role they played was minor.

(e) Communications.

(1) Radio - The AN/PRC-25 provided the battalion with excellent service during the operation. Sixty-nine of the battalion's radios were employed. The enemy captured an AN/PRC-25 from Company G. An additional communications capability was provided by a MRC-109 jeep which was helo-lifted into the battalion CP on the first day of the operation. Through the utilization of its KY-8 capability, classified information was transmitted to the battalion rear and division without the use of shackle sheets.

(2) Spare Parts - The battalion communications section sent a number of handsets and tape antennas to the field to replace those that were damaged. Toward the end of the operation a shortage of these items developed. Requisitions will be submitted to replace the parts that became unservicable due to the operation.

(f) Engineering Assistance.

(1) An engineer sweep team insured that hill 170 was cleared of mines prior to the arrival of the battalion command group. In addition, they cleared three landing zones at rifle company positions and cleared fields of fire at the command group's position.

(2) The engineers used 470 pounds of C-4 and 3000 feet of det-cord during the operation. They destroyed four caves, two bunkers, and sealed a tunnel of undermined length. Further destruction of bunkers and fortified positions could have been accomplished, however, the helicopter availability precluded resupply of explosives as ammo, food and water were given a higher precedence.

13 Special Equipment and Techniques: On two occasions, APD missions were flown over the operational area. On the evening of 8 Nov, the aircraft, making both Mode I & Mode II runs, detected several significant concentrations. All of these were subsequently fired on. On the second run, made several days later, no significant detections were made.

14 Commander's Analysis.

There were two main engagements with NVA forces that occurred during Operation ESSEX. The first engagement occurred on 6 November when Co H commenced its attack from LZ RAVEN to the east towards Objective F. The company encountered NVA units defending a heavily fortified village at grid (AT913384) hereinafter referred to as HOTELVILLE. The second main engagement occurred on 8 November when Co M was attacking Objective X at grid (AT905364). Co M encountered NVA units defending a heavily fortified village area on Objective X. Both of these main encounters with NVA units are characterized by enemy units choosing to defend in place in heavily fortified village areas. In each instance the village had a wire fence around the perimeter of the village consisting of 3 to 6 strand cattle fence with woven wire running up and down through the horizontal strands. The wire fence line was either concealed in bamboo treelines or camouflaged with bamboo and shrubs. Behind these perimeter fences the enemy had dug a communication trench along the entire perimeter that was four to six feet deep with firing positions and deep caves for protection against artillery and air attack. Some of these caves were fifteen feet deep. Spider holes, caves, and bunkers were found in depth through the village. Fortifications were carefully located to achieve an interlocking

and mutually supporting series of defensive positions. Both HOTELVILLE and MIKEVILLE were located such that attacking infantry had to cross stream barriers to approach the defensive positions. As attacking troops emerged from the stream beds they found themselves to be within close range (50-150 meters) from the enemy perimeter defenses with open rice paddy in between. HOTELVILLE and MIKEVILLE were both situated on the sides of the valley adjacent to high ground such that the enemy had ready routes of egress into the mountains.

The enemy was willing to defend in place into the night but in each case he withdrew from the fortified village positions prior to dawn in spite of heavy artillery fires delivered on and behind the village throughout the night. In summary when Marine units attacked the villages in the afternoon the enemy defended with vigor. When Marine units delayed an attack until dawn and conducted heavy preparation by air and artillery the NVA units made their escape.

It is significant to note that LZ RAVEN was located within 1000 meters of HOTELVILLE. The helicopter landing in RAVEN may have caught the NVA unit by surprise in the village. The helicopter landing was unopposed and no anti-helicopter fire was received. No fire was received from HOTELVILLE until Co H emerged from the stream bed and commenced movement within 50 meters of the village edge. NVA fire discipline was excellent considering the fact that HOTELVILLE had been subject to pre L-Hour preparation by both air and artillery.

It should be pointed out that nearly all villages in ANTENNA VALLEY were found to be fortified, some more heavily than others. Other villages in the vicinity of HOTELVILLE and MIKEVILLE were found to be just as heavily fortified. The NVA units have the capability of conducting a determined defense almost anywhere within ANTENNA VALLEY.

During Operation MISSISSIPPI in the fall of 1966 more than 2000 refugees were evacuated from ANTENNA VALLEY. It is estimated that at the start of Operation ESSEX between 400 and 600 Vietnamese people were still living in the Valley. Of these people 266 were evacuated by helicopter at their own request during Operation ESSEX to DUC DUC District Hq. Of those people remaining in the valley most had fled either before the Marines arrived or after the operation commenced. No significant civilian movement was observed during daylight hours.

Streams with steep banks prevented Amtracs from moving further east than (AT888390) in ANTENNA VALLEY. A blown bridge at (AT857407) would not permit the entry of tanks into the Valley.

15. Recommendations

- a. That close surveillance of ANTENNA VALLEY be continued and other operations be conducted when lucrative targets appear.
- b. Due to the large amount of rice fields available for food supplies operations should also be planned immediately prior to rice harvest times to deny such food to the enemy.

c. That subsequent operations in ANTENNA VALLEY utilize the high ground for helicopter assault and the direction of attack be oriented downhill rather than attacking from the Valley in an uphill direction.
